## Coming to London | student terms

Student applications to the AfL conference are invited from all people who are currently engaged in formal further education, whether full or part-time.

Student applicants do not need to be a member of AfL.

Student applications must be made on the student application form and accompanied by a personal statement of your interest and suitability and a cheque for £10 made payable to 'Archives for London Ltd'.

The personal statement must not exceed a single side of A4 paper.

Student applications should be submitted as soon as possible.

Proof of student status will be sought from the applicant's referee and institution.

There are six student places available.

Student applications will be assessed by AfL's conference sub-committee whose decision is final.

Successful student applicants are required to produce a paper on selected conference presentations and resulting discussions. They are also encouraged to participate in the activities behind the scenes to organise the conference.

Successful student applicants are required to attend the whole of the conference.

Submission of an application is regarded as acceptance of these terms.
