## Archives for the 21<sup>st</sup> century

the challenge to local authority & university archives

The Archives for the 21<sup>st</sup> century action plan, published in March, was designed to challenge chief executives and vice chancellors to shape the future of their archive services.

Nick Kingsley, Head of Archives Sector Development at The National Archives, will explore the five recommendations of the Government policy, explain how TNA and MLA are jointly planning to respond to them in the current financial climate and show how local authority and university archives are being challenged to consider their own response.

The policy represents a rare opportunity to raise the profile of archives and debate is likely to focus on how best to seize the opportunity and what actions professionals and user groups can take to capitalise on this.
